

CRITICAL STEPS

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I'M IN A MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENT?

- 1. Remain calm and secure the accident scene with hazard flashers 4. Photograph the accident scene preferably before any cars are and flares.
- 2. If needed, call for medical help immediately.
- 3. Only discuss the accident with the police and don't accept fault 6. Contact your attorney or the lawyers at Stanley Law Offices to discuss with anyone.
